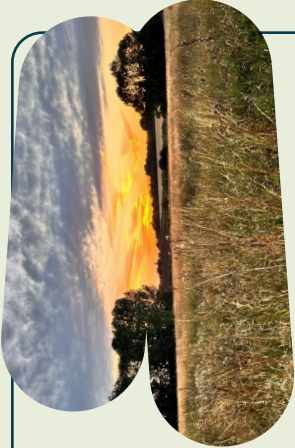

Beneath Normangate Field are the extensive remains of the Roman industrial suburbs of the town of Durobrivae.

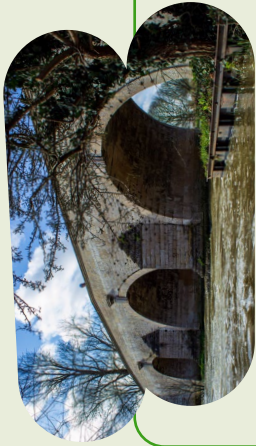
It is even possible to walk on the ridge that was once Ermine Street, the Roman road which stretched from London to York.



Ferry Meadows

Enjoy the lakes, meadows and woodland and discover our many heritage highlights.

Discover Milton Ferry Bridge built in 1716 and as you wander along the river through Bluebell Wood, keep your eyes peeled for the **wooden sculpture of a shepherd**, which marks the site of an old sheep wash pool.



Thorpe Meadows

Discover the sculptures dotted around the rowing lake, all created by different sculptors. Can you find **The Peterborough Arch** by Lee Grandjean or Festival Boat by Sokari Douglas Camp?

Orton Meadows and Thorpe Wood

Up on the ridge of Thorpe Wood Golf course once stood a **27 acre Roman Fortress** that was built in 43-44 AD at the start of the occupation.

Visit the ancient woodland of Thorpe Wood to see a carpet of bluebells in spring.



Orton Mere

Walk around this peaceful area and reflect that Orton Mere is evidence of past industry. The Mere was created as a settling pond for the washings processed from the nearby sugar beet factory.



Woodston Reach

Stop for a rest on the handcrafted bench in Woodston Rest, a small clearing created by Nene Park volunteers in 2019.
