Heritage Highlight



Spring is a great time to enjoy a riverside walk at Ferry Meadows and discover the purple bluebells in the woods. As you walk along the river you can also see evidence of the Park's Georgian history.

Not far from Milton Ferry Bridge (built in 1716) you will pass the Sheepwash sculpture by Jason Thomson. This beautiful hand carved, wooden artwork celebrates the history of this site being used to wash the sheep that used to graze on the flood meadows. Each year workers from the nearby Milton Estate would have herded hundreds of sheep over Milton Ferry Bridge and washed them in the purpose dug pool.

It is thought that the nearby Mount, was created from the soil dug from the sheep wash. The landscaped Mount provided an attractive viewpoint along the River for the Fitzwilliam Family and their guests.

Building Healthier Green Futures

We're proud to announce the launch of a new two-year project to improve the lives of young people in Peterborough, thanks to £160,000 funding from The National Lottery Community Fund.

The Building Healthier Green Futures (BHGF) project will support young people aged 11-25 in Peterborough, to develop new skills and create connections with nature and local greenspaces. This ambitious new project is led by Nene Park Trust in partnership with Peterborough Presents, Froglife and Westraven Community Café and Garden (supported by Cross Keys Homes).

BHGF will support young people to reach their potential, with a programme of training and skills development and opportunities co-designed by young people, as well as supporting improved health and wellbeing in both the young people and their communities. Through longer term engagement, the project will provide young people with opportunities to develop their skills as 'Green Mentors', as well as signposting them on to further opportunities.



A warm welcome at Nene Nursery

Thanks to funding from Morrisons Foundation, we now have a lovely wood burner (named Bernie – of course!) in the potting shed of Nene Nursery. This now means our visitors have somewhere to keep warm when they come to the nursery in the colder months. We also now have accessible seating, which means we can offer even more groups the chance to enjoy the nursery.



500 young people across Peterborough

Building on activities already happening in partnership with these organisations, such as the Nene Park Trust Young Ranger programme for 11-17 year olds and the 10-week work experience programme for 18-24 year olds not currently in Education, employment or training, BHGF will test and learn from different models of community engagement and develop and share good practice. The project aims to deliver sessions to up to 500 young people across Peterborough.

Celebrating our volunteers

Thank you to all our volunteers for getting stuck into so many different roles around the Park over the last few months!



Five dedicated volunteers supported ten Winter Festival evenings in December. Volunteer Charles Bake supported eight of these giving a massive 36.5 hours of his time! **Charles said, "Volunteering at the Winter Festival was really enjoyable. Not only did it allow me to support my Nene Park Trust colleagues, but also to help ensure visitors had a great time and left with positive memories of the event."**

Winter is the ideal time to focus on coppicing and maintaining hedgerows so that we are not disturbing any nesting birds:
64 Conservation volunteers gave us over 80 hours during January and February with a focus on these tasks throughout the Nene Park Trust estate.



The Hit Squad spent over **180 hours** on tasks that included helping to finish off our new sand martin nest box, building bird nest box kits and scrub bashing over at Eye.

Our Volunteer Rangers spent **128 hours** helping to keep the parks and wider estate clean and litter free.

4 social walks supported and guided by 5 of our social walk leaders and assistants

22 volunteers renewed their Emergency First Aid Training

15 Try Running sessions delivered to the community by our qualified volunteer leaders

Volunteer at Longthorpe Tower

Karin, a volunteer guide at Longthorpe Tower shares her experience of volunteering at the Tower.

"Like many others from Peterborough, I knew very little about Longthorpe Tower before I started volunteering here. In May 2024 a leaflet asking for volunteers dropped through my letter box. I applied and very soon after an induction and 'shadowing' longstanding volunteers, I was working as a guide support at the Tower myself. Initially nervous about what to expect, I have found volunteering a thoroughly enjoyable experience as other volunteers are supportive and always willing to teach not only the practical aspects of the work but also their collective knowledge of the history of the Tower.

The tower is open most weekends between April and October and there are tours available throughout the day, led by a team of volunteers. There is always someone to help with difficult questions. **It is a privilege to get to know the story of the Tower and its 700-year-old paintings** – the best examples of surviving medieval wall paintings in a domestic setting in northern Europe – and to help visitors understand the stories and thought behind them.



People visit from all over the world as well as across the UK. The painting of the Wheel of the Five Senses (one of only three depictions of this image in the world) is a particular draw and visitors leave enthusiastic about not only the paintings but also the story of their survival and discovery.

Unfortunately, occasionally the Tower cannot be opened to the public as there are too few volunteers to cover all sessions: **in 2024 over 1,000 visitors came to the Tower and there could have been more if it could have opened more often.** The Tower is a historical jewel in Peterborough and needs volunteers!

Listen for that Spring BUZZZZZZZZZZZZ

Every year, around mid-March, sand martins return from their winter home in West Africa and announce their arrival in the Park with their characteristic subtle buzzing calls. Listen out for it if you're coming to the Park over the next month.

Within a few weeks of their arrival, these little brown birds busy themselves with breeding. Sand martins usually nest by digging tunnels into river banks. Originally these birds nested in the steep banks around the gravel pits during the creation of the Lakes you see today in Ferry Meadows. Unfortunately the subsequent landscaping work removed any vertical banks, causing the birds to abandon the Park. However, to help redress this loss of biodiversity, ten years ago we built our first artificial sand martin nest bank on the main island in Lynch Lake, which the birds soon returned to use.

Sand martins nest in colonies where competition between birds for nest holes can be fierce. With our nest boxes the birds seem to prefer the top row of penthouse apartments, which are usually occupied first, but only after frequent squabbles between neighbours. Once the nest hierarchy has been established, in preparation for the eggs, the adults set to work collecting grass and feathers to line the nest chamber.

Typically a clutch of 5 or 6 small (10mm long) white eggs are laid. Incubation takes around 14 days and once the chicks hatch it takes another 10 frantic days or so before they fledge. Every day the chicks are in the nest the adults catch thousands of tiny gnats in flight over the lakes, a full time job for both parent to fill the ever hungry mouths of their growing brood. Once fledged, the chicks are dependent on the adults for another week or so before they depart for Africa. Many adults stay and start the whole process again and raise a second brood.



Thanks to funding from Compare the Market, and their team, who devoted a day last autumn to help us build a new box. This new box replaces the original nest box which is over 10 years old. In this time we calculate that approx. 2-3000 chicks have been raised in this one nest box.

Hopefully the buzzy calls of sand martins will be heard again soon in the Park and this coming breeding season we will see the new box fully occupied and another successful year for these delightful little birds.

Fundraising thank yous!

Over the last year we have held a fundraising appeal to Save Peterborough Arch sculpture, after the sculpture had to be removed from Thorpe Meadows due to extensive weather damage.

In February we were thrilled to reach our £3,000 fundraising target in our public appeal, thanks to a £1000 donation from Compare The Market. That donation added to £1000 already donated by Peterborough Civic Society and other donations made by the public.

This £3,000 raised in this appeal adds to the £50,000 needed for the restoration work, which is being supported by funding from The National Lottery Heritage Fund and The Henry Moore Foundation. Thank you to everyone for contributing to this appeal.

Restoration has now begun and we hope to see this very special Peterborough landmark back in its rightful place overlooking Longthorpe Parkway very soon.



We are very excited to announce we have secured over £64,000 from Arts Council England for 'Collection Connects', a project to preserve and develop the Peterborough Sculpture Collection further.



Activities will include conservation of key artworks, workshops, walks, musical performances amongst the sculptures in collaboration with Britten Sinfonia and a residency programme resulting in a new temporary sculpture commission. Keep an eye out for further details, including how you can get involved, in the coming months.
